

Travelling to The Ridge at The Ranmoor Village

The Ridge, The Ranmoor Village, Shore Lane, Sheffield, S10 3AY

The Ranmoor Village is marked as number 1 on the University location map (on the left hand side of the map).

By Car

We recommend that unless you know the city well, you should approach Sheffield from the north, east and south by the M1 (and M18 if necessary). From the west, use the A57 Snake Pass via Glossop.

From M1, M18.

Approach Sheffield on the M1 and leave the motorway at junction 33, following the City Centre signs along the dual carriageway A630/A57/A61 Parkway. Shortly after entering the 40mph zone, turn right onto the Ring Road at junction 1 - Cutler's Gate. Continue along the Ring Road following signs for "University of Sheffield", "Barnsley A61" and later "Glossop A57", through junctions 10, 9, 8 and 7. At junction 7 - Shalesmoor - turn left and continue uphill along the Ring Road, still following signs for "University of Sheffield" and "Glossop A57". Continue along Netherthorpe Road to the next roundabout - junction 6 - University Square. Take the third exit onto Western Bank. Continue straight on past the Childrens' and Western park Hospitals along Whitham Road. Continue through the next two junctions (with traffic lights), and at the third junction and set of lights continue straight along Fulwood Road - DO NOT bear right along the A57 onto Manchester Road. Proceed along Fulwood Road and turn first right onto Shore Lane. The entrance to The Ranmoor Village is about 100 metres on the left.

From the West (A57)

Follow the signs for the City Centre. After passing the Tapton Hall Church on the left, take the next right turn into Shore Lane. The entrance to The Ranmoor Village is 400 metres down on the right.

By Train

Sheffield is at the heart of the railway network. Regular services operate between Sheffield and London St. Pancras (2.5 hrs.), Birmingham (1.25 hrs.), Leeds (1hr.), Manchester (1hr.) and Nottingham (1hr.). The 40 bus runs from outside the Railway Station.

By Coach

National Express operates a comprehensive coach service to most parts of the country from Sheffield Transport Interchange, Pond Street. The fastest service to London takes approximately 3.5 hours. The 40 bus runs from the Transport Interchange.

By Air

Manchester, Leeds/Bradford, Doncaster and Nottingham East Midlands airports are all within one hours travel time of Sheffield. Manchester Airport is served by many domestic and international carriers and has a direct rail link to Sheffield which runs both day and night. Both London airports (Heathrow and Gatwick) are reasonably accessible, and both involve just one change of train. However, you should allow at least 5 hours travel time between either of these airports and Sheffield.

Local Buses

The Ranmoor Village is served by the 40 bus. Bus stops are indicated on the University location map.

The 40 bus picks up at both the Railway Station and Transport Interchange. Up to 10.00 p.m. the 40 bus runs every 6 minutes on weekdays, and every 20 minutes on Sundays.

Taxis

There are taxi ranks at the Railway Station and beside the City Hall. The journey to The Ranmoor Village takes between 15 to 20 minutes, and you should expect to pay about £8.00.

Parking

We recommend that you use public transport to travel to The Ranmoor Village. For those guests that do travel by car, parking is available strictly subject to availability and a car parking permit must be clearly displayed on the dashboard of the car. Car parking is available on the Shore Lane entrance to The Ranmoor Village. Once parked, the Ridge is found by using the footpath that runs down towards the bottom end of the site through the Windgather accommodation block (please note there are location plans situated throughout the site). Additional car parking is also available in Shore Court, which is located opposite to the entrance to The Ranmoor Village on Shore Lane. Further car parking is also available at the rear of Ranmoor Annexe, which is located towards the bottom end of Shore Lane, on the left hand side as you approach Fulwood Road.
